
Tuesday June 2

Morning Work:

 Money review (about 30 minutes) - Students will work on the worksheet labelled Tuesday. They must look at how much the toy costs and circle the correct amount of coins that matches the amount of the toy. They will show 2 different ways to pay for each toy.

Afternoon Work:

• Book report: reading **(about 30 minutes)** - Students will be



working on a book report this week. They must pick a story or book of choice that they want to write a book report on. Today is dedicated to beginning to read their book. They can read it silently or out loud to a family member.

Wednesday June 3

Morning Work:

 Money review (about 30 minutes) - Students will work on the money worksheet that is labelled Wednesday. They will be counting how much coins are shown and recording the number. Then they will look at what each person in the question spends, and figure out what they will have left after they make their purchase and record that number.

Afternoon Work:

• Book report: reading (about 30 minutes) - Students will use this time to finish reading the book that they choose for their book report.

Thursday June 4

Morning Work:

 Money review (about 30 minutes) - Students will work on the money worksheet labelled Thursday. They will be figuring out change, and circle the correct coins that would be given back.

Afternoon Work:

• Book report (about 30 minutes) - Students will work on the book report page. They will fill in the title, author and answer the questions. Each question (including the reasons portion) needs to be answered in a complete sentence.

<u>Friday June 5</u>

Morning Work:

 Money review (about 30 minutes) - Students will be working on the money worksheet labelled Friday. They will be working on some word problems involving money. They will mostly be figuring out change.

Afternoon Work:

- Reading **(about 15 minutes)** Students have the choice to read silently to themselves, or out loud to a family member.
- Journal (about 15 minutes) Students will be doing their weekly write in their journal. They will turn to a fresh page,

date their entry, and write at least 4 sentences telling me about their week.

Monday June 8

Morning Work:

• Fractions review (about 30 minutes) - Students will be working on the Fractions worksheets labelled Monday. They will be shading in to show the fractions, writing the actual fraction that is shown and comparing fractions. They should work on both pages.

Afternoon Work:

• Book report: favorite scene (about 30 minutes) - Students will be using this time to draw a picture of their favorite scene from their book. They should draw and add color. Then they will finish the sentence at the bottom of the page that explains why the scene they chose is their favorite.


